How can you join the Scottish Standing Committee?

To ensure the continued success of the SSC, we are inviting new members to join.

Eligible nominees must be full members of the Association, residing in Scotland, and in good standing. Each nomination must be proposed and seconded by two other full members residing in Scotland. Members serve a three-year term, with the option for renewal.

The SSC holds three meetings per year, typically via videoconference, but one meeting is held in person at a venue in Scotland. Members may also be asked to represent the SSC on other Association committees and working groups. If multiple nominations are received, an election will be conducted, with full and resident members residing in Scotland eligible to vote.
